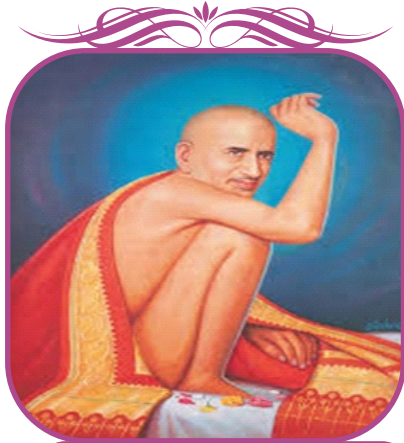

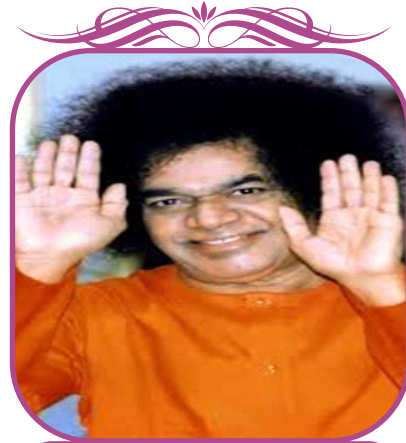

MOOT PROBLEM

International seas have been on high alert for last two decades. With disruptions in international relations of several countries, there have been incidents of attacks on commercial as well as military vessels. Dumping, environmental hazards are dealt with in a stricter manner. Piracy has been a major concern of high seas security. In this context, for an Asian country like Adian, that has sea borders three sides, maritime security forms a high priority. On the south coast of Adian, five tiny islands form a part of popular Likawika archipelago. These islands are notorious for high piracy activities. In the last six years, there have been incidents where commercial vessels have been damaged and its passengers held hostages for political favours. With a strong naval base on east, west and south coasts, Adian is constantly striving to keep a watch on any suspicious activities on its water boundaries.

Yalty is a country in the Europe that has been actively promoting safe vessel transit in international seas. It has been negotiating with its neighbours for collective efforts to counter piracy and to encourage freedom of navigation of merchant shipping. In 2011, the Republic of Yalty enacted a law in this regard.

Article 14 of the Law of Republic of Yalty No. 12 of September 2013 provides as follows:

“In order to curb the menace of piracy on international seas, the Republic of Yalty shall deploy Yaltian Military Navy Contingents on vessels flying the Yaltian flag.”

Article 17 of the Law of Republic of Yalty No. 12 of September 2013 further provides as follows:

“Pursuant to Article 14 above, in case of any threat to the vessels flying Yaltian flag, or its occupants, or cargo, the deployed Yaltian Military Navy Contingents are entitled to exercise all powers vested in them by the Republic of Yalty. These powers shall not be affected by the admiralty laws of the country in which the vessels sail.”

In November 2013, members of Yaltian Shipowners Association approached the Ministry of Defence, with a request to make mandatory provisions for Navy Personnel to accompany Yaltian ships carrying 50 or more passengers, or cargo worth 5000 Yaltian Euros or both, in piracy prone waters. Determined to take precautionary measures, on 20 December 2013, the Republic of Yalty entered into a 'Peace over Piracy Pact' between the Naval Wing of Yaltian Defence Department and Yaltian Shipowners Association.

As per the Pact, starting January 2014, all vessels with over 50 passengers or 5000 Yaltian Euros worth cargo or both, were ordered to enter the international waters only under the able supervision of officers of Yaltian Naval Wing.

In February 2014, one Captain Tarsico I kaila, was deployed on Yaltian vessel headed to Turkey from Adian. During this deployment, Tarsico had successfully rescued an oil tank from the pirates 60 nautical miles away from Adian. Whereas in April 2014, one Commander Lamore Masitik was deployed on ammunitions loaded Yaltian vessel, returning to Yalty from Pir Tanka, a country neighbouring Adian. The vessel was attacked near one of the islands from Likawika archipelago. Lamore was applauded for taking charge of the operation after the Captain was killed in firing by pirates. Lamore had succeeded in saving the vessel from any damage. In August 2014 both Tarsico and Lamore were conferred with bravery awards.

Since February 2015, various coastal parts of Asia, including southern coasts of Adian near Likawika, were declared 'extreme risk areas' owing to back to back pirate attacks on Egypt's commercial vessels.

On 9 March 2015, a Yalty flagged commercial vessel, 'Santa Lucia' departed from port Franca, in Pingasore, a small country towards the western borders of Yalty. It was headed towards Gordona, an international commercial hub for spices and herbs. The marine deployment on Santa Lucia had Tarsico as Chief in charge and Lamore as second in command. There were 3 other marine officers under Tarsico and Lamore.

Meanwhile, on the morning of 11 March 2015, one Mr. Lee Joseph- the owner of a ship Sea Pearl, his eight assistants and a team of nine marine life researchers boarded the ship for their research expedition from Rakela port on the south coast of Adian. The research project was funded by Centre for Protection of Marin Life, Rakela. On 12 March 2015, by 12.20 pm Sea Pearl was sailing in the Exclusive Economic Zone of Adian.

By 1.45pm Santa Lucia had reached international navigation area towards the south of Adian. Tarsico noticed a vessel at a distance of about 25 nautical miles from the coast of Rakela. Lamore instinctively reached for his weapons at the sight of this vessel. Believing it to be a pirate vessel, both Tarsico and Lamore opened continuous firing for about 3 minutes. There were no counter attacks. Santa Lucia managed to safely cover 40 nautical miles towards high seas of Pir Tanka, when the Adian Admiralty Emergency Coordination Centre (AAECC) contacted Santa Lucia to confirm the incident of firing reported to it by the Adian Coast Guard Vigilance Ship. On affirmative response from the Ship Master of Santa Lucia, AAECC demanded that Santa Lucia's marine deployment shall immediately return and report to the port in Rakela and provide explanation regarding the firing incident.

It was further conveyed to the Ship Master that the vessel at which Santa Lucia's marine deployment had fired, had resulted in the death of two marine life researchers – Karthik Iyer and Nishith Sundaram, whereas Fred Smith, one of Lee Joseph's assistants had suffered grave injuries.

On receiving the directions to report to Rakela port, Santa Lucia altered its course and arrived at Rakela port on the evening of 13 March 2015. Upon docking in Rakela, a detailed enquiry was conducted in respect of the firing incident by Rakela Circle Inspector. On 14 March 2015, First Information Report (F.I.R.) No.28 of 2015 was lodged in the name of Tarsico Ikaila and Lamore Masitik under Sections 302, 307 and 427 read with Section 34 of the Adian Penal Code. Both the marine officers were arrested by the Rakela Coastal Police Station In-Charge and kept in Judicial Custody as per orders of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Rakela.

On 18 March, 2015 the Chief Tribunal Officer of Republic of Yalty communicated to the Rakela Circle Inspector, Adian Ministry of Naval Defence and the Chief Minister of Rakela that the Naval Wing of Yalty Defence Department shall immediately commence investigations under Yaltian laws against its two Naval Officers and that they should thus be deported to Yalty. In spite of the increasing international pressure, the State of Rakela has refused to hand over the marine officers to Republic of Yalty.

A Writ Petition under Article 226 of the Adian Constitution is filed in Rakela High Court by the Marine Officers.

Tarsico Ikaila & Lamore Masitik along with Republic of Yalty v. State of Rakela is due for hearing in the High Court of Rakela on 13th February, 2020.

Note:

- 1) Discussions and representations in the above moot court problem are purely for educational purpose. There is no intention to incite any national or political tendencies.
- 2) All Indian laws are applicable to Adian in the given moot court problem. All International Conventions, Treaties, Protocols and Declarations are applicable to the international issues.
- 3) It is mandatory to frame arguments on minimum three and maximum five contentions.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

VENUE AND DATE

National Moot Court Competition 2020 shall be held from 13-15 February, 2020 at Dr. D Y PATIL COLLEGE OF LAW, NERUL, NAVI MUMBAI, Dr. AJAY W. PATIL, Principal, D Y PATIL COLLEGE OF LAW will be the National Administrator.

Eligibility

The competition is open only for bona fide students of recognized Institutions /Universities /Organizations who are currently pursuing their Bachelors' Degree in Law i.e. 3-Year LL.B. or 5- Year LL.B. Integrated Program.

Team composition

- i. Each team shall consist of a minimum of 2 and maximum of 3 members. This number cannot be modified under any circumstances.
- ii. There shall be 2 speakers and 1 researcher designated in a 3 member team while in case of a 2 member team, both the members shall be considered to be speakers. Teams shall identify the speakers and researcher during registration. No extra member or observer shall be allowed.
- iii. Every Participating Team will be allotted a team code which will be communicated in due time via email.

REGISTRATION

There shall be a registration fee of Rs.3,000/— for local teams (within Mumbai) and Rs.4,000/— for Outside teams (outside Mumbai).

There shall be only one registration per institution.

Teams are Requested to send the duly filled registration forms along with DD on or before 20th January, 2020.

Registrations will be confirmed only on the receipt of the hardcopy of the registration form along with DD.

Hardcopies are to be sent to **“The Principal, Dr. D. Y. Patil College of Law, Dr. D. Y. Patil University, Sector-7, Nerul, Navi Mumbai - 400 706.”**

The DD shall be drawn in favour of **“Dr. D.Y Patil College of Law”**, payable at

Navi Mumbai. In the meantime, teams shall send a scanned copy of the filled registration form to dypatil.mootcourt@gmail.com for interim registration. Participants are requested to kindly ensure before dispatching the form that the registration form bears the signature and seal of their institution's Principal.

Teams can also pay the registration fees via **UPI PAYMENTS** i.e. **“GOOGLE PAY”** or **“PHONEPE”** to the contact number **7400143169 (PRANZAL JHA)**.

Participants will receive an approval as acceptance of their request for participation by the very next day of receiving mail by 8:00PM or earlier.

Registrations without the scanned copy of the approval letter from the college/institution/ university or duly attested registration form will not be valid.

CLARIFICATIONS

- i. Clarifications can be sought on any part of the moot proposition and must be clear. These clarifications are to be send via e-mail at dypatil.mootcourt@gmail.com.
- ii. It is at the discretion of the Organizing committee to decide whether a clarification sought for is valid and to be clarified.
- iii. The clarification e-mails are to be send on or before **specified date**.

ANONYMITY OF TEAMS:

Participants/ Participating Teams shall not disclose their names and the identity of their respective institution/ college/university at any time before the award ceremony. Each team shall be issued individual codes, at the time of the registration and the same shall be the sole source of identity of the respective teams throughout the competition.

Note: All Participants shall refrain from wearing, using or carrying in any form, any identifying items, such as badges, blazers, pins or any other identifying material(s) such as a books/bags with a college/university/library logo or seal.

Memorials:

Each team shall research about the moot problem and prepare memorial from both sides, namely, plaintiff/ petitioner/ appellant and defendant/ respondent as the case maybe.

Format of Memorials-

Cover must be placed on brief as follows

Petitioners/Applicant/Appellant: **Blue Colour** Respondents: **Red Colour**

Cover page shall include the team code of the team on upper right-hand corner, name of the case, parties on behalf of whom written submissions are made, name of the forum approached for dispute resolution and year.

- ◆ **Table of Contents.**
- ◆ **List of abbreviations.**
- ◆ **Index of Authorities**
- ◆ **Statement of Jurisdiction**
- ◆ **Statement of Facts**
- ◆ **Issues Raised**
- ◆ **Summary of Arguments**
- ◆ **Arguments Advanced (not more than 15pages)**
- ◆ **Prayer**

MEMORIAL GENERAL FORMAT:

FONT AND SPACING:

All written submissions shall be typed on A4 size paper in the following format in Times New Roman (font type), in 12 points (font size), and for footnotes it should be 10, line spacing 1.5, both sides Justified, and headings to be bold in the same font and size.

Written submission shall contain a border.

Page numbering should be at the bottom middle of each page.

MARGIN: Each page shall have 1-inch margin from each side.

The memorial shall be spiral bound only and shall not contain more than **25 pages** (including cover page, table of content, list of abbreviations and index).

****The memorials should be spiral bound. Any other form of binding shall not be accepted*.***

CITATIONS: All teams shall give footnotes by adhering to Blue Book: A Uniform System of Citation (20th Edition).

PLAGIARISM: The organizing committee reserves the right to disqualify a team, at any stage of the competition, if the memorial or any other part thereof, if found to be plagiarized.

The teams may submit a separate paper book of not more than 100 pages (printed on both sides), which will carry all the annexure and case laws that have been referred to in the memorial. The paper book will have a white cover. The teams will retain them and may be submit to the judges during the rounds through the court assistants for reference. Any identifying marks/seal of the college shall attract severe penalties including disqualification. There will not be any passing of notes to the judges. The paper book will have to take care of this requirement. The team will take them back after the respective rounds.

NOTE: Not complying with any of the above-mentioned format would attract penalties leading to deduction of points which would be on the discretion of the Organizing committee.

SUBMISSION OF SOFTCOPIES:

Each provisionally registered team shall submit a soft copy, both in Microsoft Word format and PDF format (.docx and .pdf) of the memorials from both sides, via email to the Organizing Committee at dypatil.mootcourt@gmail.com , on or before specified date.

- ◆ The subject of the email should be the following:
“MEMORIAL SUBMISSION of TEAM *(team code)”**.
- ◆ **The team codes will be assigned one week before the date of submission of soft copies of memorials.**
- ◆ The name of the file containing the memorial from the plaintiff/ petitioner / appellant's side should be **“PLAINTIFF/ PETITIONER/ APPELLANT”** (as the case maybe). The name of the file containing the respondent's side should be **“DEFENDANT/ RESPONDENT”**.

Submission of hardcopies:

- ◆ Hardcopies of the following documents are to be submitted by the teams **on the day of their arrival for the competition** while they register onsite:
 - a. Registration form; and
 - b. Memorials
- ◆ The teams that shall bring **7 hard-copies of their memorial from both the sides** (total 14 copies) when they arrive on specified date.
- ◆ The softcopy submitted and the hardcopy submitted during the registration have to be identical. Any discrepancies observed may lead to a severe penalty that may include but is not limited to, the disqualification of the team.

Marking of Memorials

Every Memorial shall be marked on a total of 100 marks and the team memorial marks will be the average of the total of both sides. The following shall be the marking scheme:

- a. Knowledge of Facts and Laws (20marks)
- b. Use of Authorities/Precedents (20marks)
- c. Correct format and citation (20marks)
- d. Presentation (20marks)
- e. Grammar (10 marks)
- f. Originality (10)

DRESS CODE:

Inside the Court Room the participants shall be in formal wear only.

- i. Male participants are required to wear a full suit - comprising of a black formal blazer and trousers, full sleeved shirts, ties and formal footwear.
- ii. Ladies: White salwar and kurta or white shirt and black trousers or skirt along with a black blazer and black shoes.

Researcher Test:

A Researcher Test shall also be conducted for adjudicating the “Best Researcher” on the specified date. The Speakers shall not be eligible to participate in the test. However, in case of a 2-member team, one of the speakers shall be eligible to appear for the Researcher Test and that shall be notified to the Organizers at the time of Formal Registration.

Oral Rounds

- ◆ In each oral round, a team shall be represented by two speakers to present the arguments. The researcher shall not participate in the arguments but has to be present during the Oral Rounds.

- ◆ Division of time should be informed to the Court Assistants/Clerks at the beginning of the round. The oral arguments need to be confined to the issues presented in the memorials. In the Preliminary Rounds, each Team shall argue once as Petitioner and once as a Respondent. All teams are expected to carry with themselves any case law and authorities which they intend to refer to.

ROUNDS

- ◆ There will be two preliminary rounds, an octa final, a quarterfinal, a semi-final and a final round.
- ◆ Octa final will be conducted if the participation exceeds 30 teams.
- ◆ Quarter final will be conducted if the participation exceeds 16 teams.

NOTE: Final format of the rounds and fixtures of every round will be informed to all the respective teams via email after the closing of registration.

STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION:

- ◆ The competition will be held for three days.
- ◆ The Registration will be done on the 1st day followed by the: -
- ◆ Orientation & draw of lots
- ◆ Researcher's test.
- ◆ There shall be two Preliminary Rounds, Octa-final/quarter-final round, a semi-final round and a final round. Lots picked by the teams will decide the side of the arguments in Preliminary, octa-final/Quarter-Final, Semi-Finals & Final Round.
- ◆ **Rest parts of the competition will be scheduled as per the time and schedule which will be announced after the last date of registration via e-mail.**

PRELIMINARY ROUND

- ◆ There shall be two preliminary rounds wherein every Participating Team shall be required to argue once from each side.
- ◆ Each team will be given a total of 25 minutes to present their case. The time includes questioning by judges. The division of time is left on the discretion of the team members, subject to a maximum of 15 minutes per speaker. A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal or sur-rebuttal. Judges

may at their discretion, extend the time allotted for the oral arguments up to a maximum of 5 minutes

- ◆ No team shall argue against the same team more than once in preliminary rounds, nor will they argue before the same panel of judges. This will be determined by a predetermined confidential fixture by the Organizing Committee.

OCTA-FINAL/QUARTER FINAL

- ◆ Top sixteen / eight teams from the Preliminary Rounds will advance to the Octa / Quarter final rounds.
- ◆ The Octa /Quarter-final round shall be a knock out round consisting of 16/8 teams in total respectively. The teams shall be required to plead only once, either from the side of the Plaintiff/ Petitioner/ Appellant or Defendant/ Respondent. The side shall be determined by draw of lots in the following manner:
 - ◆ In order to ensure a fair competition, the top 8/4 teams from Preliminary Round shall not be allowed to argue against each other in octa/quarter final.
 - ◆ The bottom 8/4 teams from the Preliminary Round shall draw lots to decide their opponent; the opponent shall be a team that has secured one of the top 4 spots in the Preliminary Rounds.
 - ◆ The side from which the teams plead will be further determined by another draw of lots.
 - ◆ Teams shall be required to exchange their memorials before both these rounds and shall return the same intact, to the Organizing Committee on completion of their respective rounds.
 - ◆ Each team will be given a total of 25 minutes to present their case. The time includes questioning by judges. The division of time is left on the discretion of the team members. A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal or sur-rebuttal. Judges may at their discretion, extend the time allotted for the oral arguments up to a maximum of 5 minutes

SEMI-FINALS

- ◆ Top four teams from the Quarter Final Round shall qualify for the Semi-final round. It shall be a knock out round; the side for pleading and the opponent teams shall be determined on the basis of draw of lots.
- ◆ Each team will get a minimum of 30 minutes to argue from the allotted side
- ◆ A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal or sur-rebuttal. Judges may at their discretion, extend the time allotted for the oral arguments up to a maximum of 5 minutes

FINAL ROUND

- ◆ Top two teams from the Semi Final Round shall qualify for the final round. It shall be a knock out round; the side for pleading and the opponent teams shall be determined on the basis of draw of lots.
- ◆ Each team will get a minimum of 35 minutes to argue from the allotted side
- ◆ A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal or sur-rebuttal. Judges may at their discretion, extend the time allotted for the oral arguments up to a maximum of 5 minutes

ASSESSMENT CRITERION FOR ORAL PLEADINGS

Team performance of the orators shall be judged in all rounds on the basis of following criterion-

- a. Knowledge of the Facts (20 marks)
- b. Application of Laws to the Fact and Interpretation (20 marks)
- c. Argumentative Skills (20 marks)
- d. Clarity of Thoughts and Expression (10 marks)
- e. Court Mannerisms (10marks)
- f. Response to Questions (10 marks)
- g. Rebuttal/ Sur-rebuttal (10 marks)

Calculation of marks for each round

- ◆ Each preliminary round shall be decided on the basis of allocation of a total of 100 marks.

- ◆ The team scoring the highest out of 100 in each round will be declared as the winner.
- ◆ In case of a tie, researcher's test marks will be used as a deciding factor.

SCOUTING

No member of any team will be permitted to witness the arguments in any courtroom in which that team is not one of the participating teams whilst that team is a part of the competition. If this rule is violated, the Organizing Committee shall take strict actions, which may include but may not be limited to, the expulsion of the said team from the competition.

Passing of notes to the speakers by the researcher during the rounds is allowed.

- Depending on the point of arrival (Station within Mumbai, Airport, Bus-Stand), a volunteer will guide you to the nearest taxi/rickshaw/local train or bus as preferred by the participants to reach the facility where teams will be accommodated.
- The name and mobile number of the student volunteers in charge of transport / accommodation will also be made available after finalization.
