His personality was multi facets spreading in political and social-cultural dimensions. His object was not confined to establish the education Institutions, but went beyond those horizons by culminating into real world which was seen in appreciation and various welcomes given to him on various occasions. We all take inspirations from what he did in his life.

About Institution:

In the year 1999, IIMT, an appendage to the GGSIP University, was set up under the aegis of New Millennium Education Society with an objective to establish and run Institution for Professional, Technical and Management Education as per policies and the regulations of the Government. In tune with the requirements of the New Millennium, the society made a modest beginning and could take the IIMT & School of Law to a commendable position as a premier Institute in trans-Yamuna Area when BA. LL.B (H) was added in 2006 to different courses of Management and Education. The three batches of the School of Law have already joined the 'Bar' in Delhi, the corporate sector and the higher studies in India and abroad.

About the Debate:

A general outrage spreading across different forums-such as social media legal community and Parliament was seen after the horrific gang rape in the Capital of the Country- a country which is battling with the stigma of rising of crime against women. Various laws, sub-laws, rules, orders, notifications coupled with various establishment measures were taken ignoring the emotive calls for death penalty for rapist. However, the deterrent effect of such laws including those which were passed after the *Mathura rape case*, seems to be no effect. According to NCRB, an increased rate of crime against women i.e. 8.9% in 2008 to 9.4% in 2012, was recorded and Delhi was found on the top of the list. Hence, the vision enshrined in this National Debate will hopefully cast a deep light upon the proposed deterrent element consisting in certainty of conviction or/and a bunch of laws.
