Introduction:

Arbitration is therefore well suited to resolving these cross-border disputes. As such, its sophistication continues to develop and its popularity grows. But how does it work? V.INBAVIJAYAN (www.inbavijayan.com) was educated at the Dr. Ambedkar Government Law College, Madras, India. After completing his legal education, he took up litigation at the Madras High Court in 1997. His enthusiasm towards Arbitration made him pursue whole-time arbitration practice since 2001. He has presided as the sole arbitrator in over 300 domestic cases, 5000 documents-only small-claims finance arbitrations and 11 international arbitrations. He has appeared before arbitral tribunals in over 20 ad-hoc and institutional disputes. To say the least, he has been nominated as Director of CI Arb (India). He has been accredited as an arbitrator in HKIAC, CIETAC, BAC, ICADR, ICA etc. He is a co-founder and former secretary of an arbitration institution, CNICA and inducted as member of International Council for Commercial Arbitration (ICCCA), the Heague.
