of mediation for law students

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THE MEDIATION BOOT CAMP

The Mediation Boot Camp is an initiative of PACT to empower the young generation of lawyers in the concept of consensual dispute resolution (CDR), especially mediation and conciliation. This program will provide students with core mediation skills and hands-on experience through a variety of simulations. This will be a platform to learn effective professional communication and client focussed representation.



The program will enable the participants to understand the legal framework governing mediation, and the role of a counsel as a pro-mediation lawyer. The workshop would be a combination of theory and roleplays – extensive simulations and case studies involving roles as clients, counsel, and mediators, so as to provide the students with the opportunity to have real-life application and development of their skills in consensual dispute resolution. The programme will also

exclusively deal with disputes in IPR, and how mediation offers several advantages for the resolution of intellectual property disputes. Mediation, specifically, is an attractive option for parties that place a premium on the preservation or enhancement of their relationship, seek to maintain control over the dispute settlement process, value confidentiality, or want to reach a speedy settlement without damage to their reputations. Parties to contracts or relationships involving the exploitation of intellectual property often share these goals when a dispute arises.

JONATHAN RODRIGUES is a certified mediator listed with the Indian Institute of Arbitration and Mediation (IIAM), and is currently posted as the World Mediation Organization’s (WMO) Continental Advisor for Asia. He is also the development officer for Asia with the SCMA (London) and has been trained as a commercial mediator by the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs (IICA), under the aegis of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs. He is the Founding President of Lex Infinitum: VMSCL-WMO International Dispute Resolution Competition, which premieres in Goa. He is also the co-founder of the Peacekeeping and Conflict Resolution Trust (PACT). Jonathan is a listed member with the Young Mediators’ Initiative (YMI) and the Goa Community Mediation Centre (GCMC). He has trained as a Restorative Facilitator in Bangalore with Real Justice (Australia) and the International Institute of Restorative Practices (IIRP). He worked briefly as

a Mediation Associate with the Centre for Advanced Mediation Practice (CAMP), Bangalore. Having graduated in Psychology and Law, Jonathan has travelled to Europe and Asia as a WMO representative for conferences and mediation events.
