Who We Are?

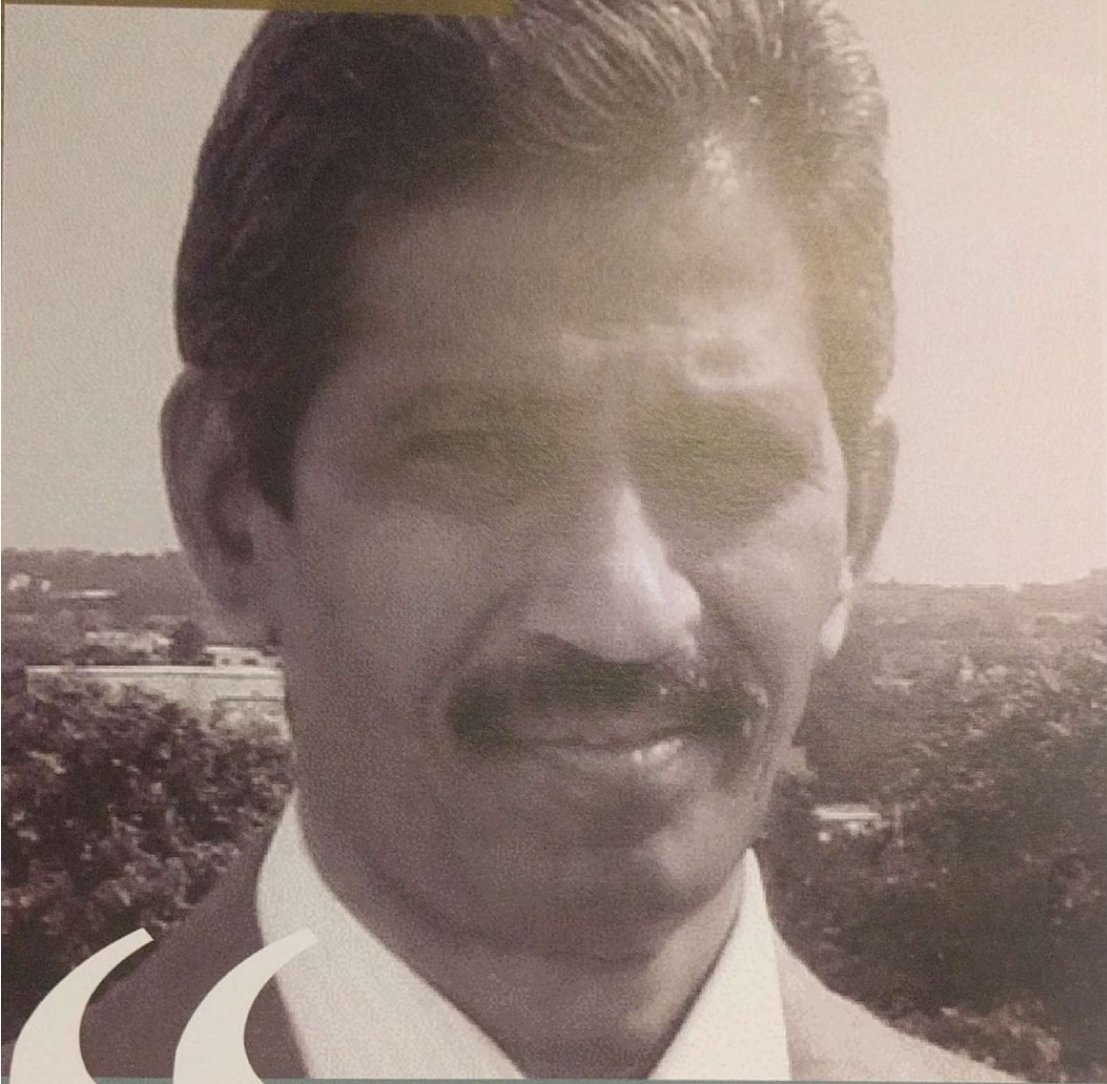
