About University

Brief History and Present Infrastructure

One of the oldest Universities in India, the Panjab University (PU) initiated at Lahore in 1882, has a long tradition of pursuing excellence in teaching and research in science and technology, humanities, social sciences, performing arts and sports. The University supports excellence and innovation in academic programmes, promotes excellence in research, scholarship and teaching. The University is committed to attract and support the best students and faculty, who excel at teaching and research. In independent India, Panjab University with its Campus at Chandigarh and nearly two hundred colleges in Punjab state and Chandigarh U.T., has served various societal needs with distinction. The glorious traditions of the University established during the period of more than 133 years of its long service to the nation since its inception are a source of inspiration for the present generation of faculty members and students. By virtue of its history, experience, achievements and philosophy, the Panjab University has a national character and it enjoys an international stature drawing both faculty and students from all over the country and different parts of the globe. Its faculty includes some of the most distinguished scientists and academicians. It continues to attract celebrated scholars at the campus. Over the years, the reputation of the Panjab University has grown to emerge as an institution at the pinnacle in innovative teaching, research and community outreach.

In Chandigarh, Panjab University campus was designed for by Pierre Jeanneret under the general guidance of Le Corbusier. Panjab University moved to Chandigarh during 1958-1960. Till the re-organisation of Punjab in 1966, the University had its regional centres at Rohtak, Shimla and Jalandhar and its affiliated colleges were located in the States of Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh and the Union Territory of Chandigarh. With the re-organization of Punjab, the University



became an Inter-State Body Corporate catering to the newly organized States of Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Punjab and the Union Territory of Chandigarh. Gradually, the colleges of Himachal and Haryana were affiliated to the Universities in the respective states and the Panjab University was left with the affiliated colleges in the Union Territory of Chandigarh and some parts of Punjab. The Panjab University Campus at Chandigarh accommodates seventy three teaching and research departments/institutes/centres besides four independent Chairs for research. Furthermore, the university has 189 affiliated/constituent colleges spread over Punjab and Chandigarh besides Regional Centres at Muktsar, Ludhiana, Hoshiarpur and Kauni. In addition, there is the Vishveshvaranand Vishwa Bandhu Institute of Sanskrit and Indological Studies at Hoshiarpur.

The Campus

Panjab University is located in Sector 14 and Sector 25 of Chandigarh, spreading across an area of almost 550 acres.

Teaching Departments/Centres

The academic institutes on the campus and four Regional Centres are grouped under the Faculties of Arts, Science, Languages, Law, Education and Fine Arts, Business Management and Commerce, Engineering and Technology, Medical Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences and Dairying, Animal Husbandry and Agriculture. Most of the departments have their own specialized libraries, and the working period runs for at least 180 days in a year. The University School of Open Learning, a multi-disciplinary department, caters to more than 25000 distance learners and offers over 20 traditional and job oriented courses.

Research Initiatives

The University is participating in various prestigious International High Energy Research Programmes at Fermilab (USA), KEK (Japan) and CERN (Switzerland). At present, the University is involved in a big way in CMS and ALICE Experiments at CERN (European Organization for Nuclear Research) Switzerland and Neutrino Programme at Fermilab, USA. The CMS (Compact Muon Solenoid) project at the Large Hadron Collider is for the discovery of Higgs Boson and other new particles. Under such International Research programs, the University had earlier been involved in the Top Quark Discovery (1995) and CP-violation discovery (2001).

a) International Collaborations:

The University recently signed MoUs with University of Nottingham (UK), University of Birmingham (UK), Nottingham Trent University (UK) and University of Western Sydney (Australia). PU also has collaborations with National Science Technology and Development Agency, Thailand; University of Missouri, USA and Universidade de Aveiro, Portugal; International Crops Research Institute for Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT), Hyderabad; International Centre for Agricultural Research in Dry Areas (ICARDA), Morocco for a joint collaborative project funded by the Consultative group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR) consortium, funded by organisations such as UNDP and FAO, USA, UK, and Germany; International Centre for Agricultural Research in Dry Areas (ICARDA),



Morocco; World Vegetable Research Centre, Taiwan through its South Asia Centre at Hyderabad and Baylor Medical centre, Dallas, U.S.A.

b) National collaborations:

The University has various prestigious collaborations with a number of national institutes like Indian Agricultural Research Institute, Delhi; GB Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar; Himalayan Forest Research Institute, Shimla; IIT, Roorkee; PGIMER, Chandigarh; Nuclear Science, Delhi; IMTECH; CSIO, Chandigarh; Institute of Nuclear Medicine and Allied Sciences (INMAS), New Delhi; Jamia Hamdard University, Delhi; Atomic Energy Regulatory Board of India, Mumbai; Central University, Hyderabad; Agriculture University, Palampur; Inter University Consortium (Kolkata & Bhubaneswar).

Prominent Research Funding: The University is getting liberal grants for pursuing research from various national & international agencies. Recently, the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, selected the Panjab University as one among the top fourteen universities of India for further funding under the Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (DST-PURSE) programme. Under this prestigious scheme, the university will receive Rs. 34.8 crore for the development of research infrastructure, which could be utilized in the period from 2014 to 2018, of which Rs. 6 crore has already been received during 2014. To participate in the CMS project, the Department of Science and Technology and the Department of Atomic Energy have provided Rs. 19 crore for the Twelfth Five-Year Plan.

About Law Department

The Department of Laws, originally established at Lahore in 1889, was re-established at Shimla in 1948, shifted to Jalandhar in 1950 and finally re-located at the University Campus at Chandigarh in 1959. Its Alumni include Judges of the Supreme Court and High Courts, Union Cabinet Ministers, State Chief Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, Ambassadors, Senior Bureaucrats, Police Officers and other legal luminaries.

Justice imparting system is the foundation of every civilized nation. Law department formerly known as University Law College is committed to play an important role in the legal system of this university. Stature of this department is as big as its strength. Law graduates from this department are serving all over the country in the lower courts, High Courts and Supreme Court. The faculty of the department consists of 9 Professors, 2 Associate Professors, 5 Assistant Professors, 8 part-time teachers, guest faculty and many Research Scholars working on various Research Programmes.

The Department is the pride alma mater of three Chief Justices of India, a large number of Chief Justices of the High Courts, members of subordinate judiciary, civil servants, law officers and members of the legal profession and a large number of legal luminaries and justices. The number of its alumni, which rose to the bench of the Supreme Court and in many High Courts of this country, is too large to mention. Chief Justice of India Dr. A.S. Anand, the former Chief Justice of India taught in this department for a number of years. The former Chief Justice of India Hon'ble Mr. Justice J.S.



Khehar has also been our proud alumnus and taught in the department as well.

The Department is always in action to create new opportunities for its students. In the past, the department had MoU with ELSA (European Law Student Association) and run an exchange programme with University of Stockholm. The department had also signed MoU with Fancy Barristers, P.C., New York School to run a course on Demonstrative Advocacy.

Legal Aid Clinic-cum-Arbitration Centre as well as a Placement Cell are also functioning in the department. The Department has provision for special lectures in memory of Justice Mehr Chand Mahajan and S. Ajit Singh Sarhadi. These lectures have been delivered over the years by eminent persons such as Justice V.K. Krishna Iyer, Justice V.S. Deshpande, Professor Upinder Bakshi, Dr. L.M. Singhvi, Professor Mool Chand Sharma, Justice J.S. Verma, Mr. Soli J. Sorabjee and Prof. M.R. Madhava Menon. The department has a good library with more than 56,000 documents and 52 regularly subscribed Indian and foreign journals. The Department has also the distinction of having Depository Library for United Nations Documents which is the only library with more than 8000 documents North of India. The Department regularly publishes a Law Journal (Panjab University Law Review)

Rules in Detail:

CLIENT COUNSELLING

1. NATURE AND PURPOSE OF THE COMPETITION

i. PURPOSE:

- Promoting greater knowledge and developing an interest among law students in the preventative law and counselling functions of law practice, Client Counselling encourages students to develop interviewing, planning, and analytical skills in the lawyer-client relationship in the law office.
- Interviewing and advising are a significant part of most lawyers' work. Too often, it is assumed that lawyers have the listening and questioning skills needed to conduct an effective interview. Regrettably, not all lawyers possess these skills.
- The Competition provides an opportunity for a valuable educational and cultural interchange between students, law teachers, and legal practitioners.

ii. NATURE OF THE COMPETITION:

- The Competition simulates a law office consultation in which two law students, acting as lawyers are presented with a client matter.
- The students conduct an interview with a person playing the role of the client. Students are expected to elicit the relevant information from the client, explore with the client his or her preferred outcome, outline the nature of the problem, and present the client with a means (or range of alternatives, if appropriate) for resolving the problem.
- The interview with the client is then followed by a post-consultation period during which the students, in the absence of the client, analyze the interview and discuss the legal and other work to be undertaken.
- The interview and post-consultation period last a total of 45 minutes. The students are evaluated by a panel of judges, usually composed of two lawyers and a counsellor (*e.g.*, social or welfare worker, psychologist, or another person with extensive experience in counselling). The inclusion of a non-lawyer counsellor on the judging panel is designed to broaden the interdisciplinary perspectives of the panel both in terms of skills and possible solutions to a problem.
- The students are evaluated against specific criteria that emphasize the use of listening, questioning, planning, and analytical skills in a lawyer/client interview.

2. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- i. Each team shall be composed of **two law students** pursuing LL.B. (3years), B.A.LL.B, B.COM.LL.B, BBA LL.B, LL.B. (5 years) course or LL.M.
- ii. **Only one team** from a University/ College / Institute is allowed.

3. GENERAL FORMAT OF THE COMPETITION; TIME LIMITS; USE OF MATERIALS AND PROPS

i. MAXIMUM TIME LIMIT FOR THE SESSION

- Each team shall have a maximum of **45 minutes** to complete the session.
- This session must include both a consultation session with the client and a post-consultation
- These 45 minutes shall be **bifurcated as follows:**
 1. 20 minutes- consultation with the client

2. 10 minutes- post consultation
3. 15 minutes- Judges' interaction (Question Answer Session)

ii. **CONSULTATION WITH THE CLIENT**

- Each team must conduct a consultation with the client during which the students are expected to elicit the relevant information, outline the problem, and propose options for resolving the problem.
- Team members are entirely free to decide how they will divide their work, but both students must consult with the client as a team and their plan is subject to judging.
- The students may wish, during their post-consultation presentation, to explain why they worked together in the way that they did.

iii. **POST-CONSULTATION**

- Each team must also conduct a meaningful post-consultation discussion between the participants after the client has left the room.
- During this post-consultation, the students shall talk to each other loudly enough to be overheard by the judges
- The post-consultation performance may summarize the interview, indicate the scope of the legal work to be undertaken, and state the legal issues that should be researched. Explanation of the position or attitude taken by the students may be useful.
- Clients should not be present during the post-consultation period

iv. **DIVISION OF TIME**

- Under no circumstance will a team be allowed more than forty-five (45) minutes to complete the session, including both the consultation and the post-consultation.
- The timekeeper shall stop students after forty-five (45) minutes regardless of where students are in the consultation or post-consultation process.
- The decision of the timekeeper as to when the round should end is final.
- There shall be deduction of marks in case the time overshoots

v. **USE OF MATERIALS AND PROPS**

- During the consultation and post-consultation, the team may use books, notes, and other materials.
- The team may also use office props to setup an Office structure, however none of them will be provided by the Host Institution and the participants must bear in mind that **no electronic information** can be used or accessed during the competition (This includes all electronic items like Laptops, Mini Computers, E-Tablets, I-Pods, Mobile Phones etc.).

4. **THE CONSULTATION SITUATIONS; FEES; ROUNDS; ATTIRE**

i. **CONSULTATION SITUATIONS**

- The Consultation Situations for competition shall be based on 'Family law, Criminal law, Laws of Contract' and Consumer law.
- The Consultation Situations for all Rounds will be based on the given topics only; however, each round may involve a different client and a different situation.
- The Consultation Situation for each round will not be revealed.
- An **Orientation session** shall be conducted 30 minutes prior to the actual event where a briefing regarding how to go about the competition shall be provided

ii. **DISCUSSION OF FEES WITH THE CLIENTS**

- The discussion of fees is an integral part of any first consultation between a lawyer and a client. Students should be judged on how they approach this problem, but not on the monetary amount used.
- The participants may discuss fees at any appropriate point in the consultation.
- Fees may be waived or suitably reduced only in cases of financial hardship, either for persons of low income or for persons of ordinary income faced with very large fees

iii. **ROUNDS**

- There shall be 3 rounds- Preliminary, Semi-Final and Final
- However, if the number of teams permit then there shall be a Quarter Final round as well
- Number of teams per round:
 - Preliminary round- all
 - Quarter Finals- 8
 - Semi Finals- 4
 - Finals- 2

iv. **ATTIRE**

- It is expected that the Participants will dress formally in a Black coat and trousers, white shirt and a black tie for all the competition rounds and the Awards Ceremony. Girls may wear a white Salwar and black Kurta or any black and white combination
- However, the uniforms comprising neck ties/ cravats of the law colleges/ law schools are not allowed.

5. **CLIENTS**

- i. The Competition **organizers are responsible** for selecting persons to play the role of the client for each of the sessions

6. **ASSESSMENT CRITERIA**

- i. The students are evaluated against a specific criteria that emphasize the use of listening, questioning, planning, and analytical skills in a lawyer/client interview
- ii. A copy of the "Assessment Criteria" shall be forwarded to the participants post registration

7. **REGISTRATION**

- i. Registration fee is **Rs. 1000/- per team**
- ii. Only one team from each institution is allowed.
- iii. Each team will be provided with a team code after registration.
- iv. It is mandatory for the participants to carry their college ID Cards

8. **SCHEDULE**

- i. The competition will be held over a span of 2 days
- ii. 1st day-
 - Preliminary round
 - Quarter Finals (if the number of teams are adequate)
- iii. 2nd day-



- Semi-Finals
- Final

9. PRIZES WORTH RS 25,000/-

- Winning team: Rs 10500/-
- Runners up team: Rs 7500/-
- Best advocate: Rs 3500/-
- Best Client: Rs 3500/-

10. 'SAVING CLAUSE

- The Judges' decision will be final and binding
- The Organisers reserve the rights to mend any rule and the same shall be notified to all the teams well in time

OPEN DEBATE:

1. NO. OF PARTICIPANTS:

- The total number of participants shall not exceed 50 and shall be selected through a first come, first serve basis.
- One half of the participating contestants shall be in favour of the motion of the house while the other half shall be against the motion.
- The choice of side of motion shall be declared by draw of lots and shall be informed to the participants 1 week prior to the event.
- The limit on the number of participants can be altered without prior notice.

2. AGENDA:

- The motion of the house shall be declared one week prior to the contest.

3. LEADER OF HOUSES:

- The leaders of the team 'for' and 'against' the motion shall be selected by way of written answers in the registration form that shall be a part of the registration process.
- Each side shall have one leader only.

4. PROCEDURAL RULES:

- The event shall be of 2 days.
- The leader of the team 'for' the motion shall introduce the motion of the house with an introductory speech. Subsequently, the leader of the team 'against' the motion shall make his introductory speech.
- The General Speakers list shall follow thereafter.
- The members of both the teams are free to introduce sub-motions in the house, however, ensuring that the same pertain to the core agenda at hand.



- v. Teams shall debate and discuss the agenda, with every debater free to come in at any time of the debate, however, subject to the prior permission of the adjudicating/moderating authority.
- vi. The affirmative has the right to make any reasonable definition of each of the terms of the motion. If the negative challenges the reasonableness of a definition by the affirmative, the judge shall accept the definition of the team that shows better grounds for its interpretation of the term.
- vii. He who asserts must prove. In order to establish an assertion, the team must support it with enough evidence and logic to convince an intelligent but previously uninformed person that it is more reasonable to believe the assertion than to disbelieve it. Facts must be accurate.
- viii. The teams shall mandatorily be open to rebuttal. The questions may be asked either by the opposing team or the adjudicating/moderating authority.
- ix. Personal remarks/questions/statements shall lead to disqualification of such member making it.
- x. Debaters can also use chits to aware the adjudicating/moderating authority about any factual error, rebuttals (if any) as well as about related subjects.
- xi. The house is required to come up with solutions/conclusive arguments in a written manner which shall be open to amendments by the team 'against' the motion.
- xii. The final draft shall be put to vote and the members shall decide the fate of the motion.
- xiii. No electronic device such as laptops, mobiles shall be used by the debaters. Use of internet is strictly prohibited.
- xiv. The decision of the adjudicating/moderating authority shall be final and binding.

5. DRESS CODE:

- i. It is expected that the Participants will dress formally in a Black coat and trousers, white shirt and a black tie for all the competition rounds and the Awards Ceremony. Girls may wear a white Salwar and black Kurta or any black and white combination
- ii. However, the uniforms comprising neck ties/ cravats of the law colleges/ law schools are not allowed.

LAW QUIZ:

1. AREAS OF INTEREST:

Constitutional Law, Personal Laws (Hindu, Muslim, Christian and Jewish), Laws of Contract (Sale of Goods Act, Special Contract Act), Law of Torts, Consumer Protection Laws, Company Laws, Criminal Laws, Environmental Laws, Property Law (Tangible Property and Non – Tangible Property), Labour Laws and Medico – Legal Laws.

2. RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- I. Only team entries are eligible.
- II. The Quiz will be held centrally and is open to all the students of full time LLB (3 year course), BA-LLB, BCom-LLB, BBA-LLB (5 years) & BTech LLB (6 years) affiliated to universities.
- III. Participants pursuing degrees through distance mode learning and diploma are “Not Eligible”
- IV. Each Team shall comprise of **maximum two members** from the same Department/Institute/Centre and is there no restriction on the number of teams participating from each Department/Institute/Centre.
- V. It is mandatory for all the members of a team to get themselves registered and also to carry their ID cards into the venue.
- VI. The Quiz Competition will be held in 3 stages which are as follows:
 - a) Elimination Round
 - b) Preliminary Round
 - c) Final Round
- VII. In Stage I, Elimination round, a written test of qualifying nature will be conducted. All the registered teams will participate in this round. This round will comprise of 30 multiple choice questions on General Laws. 12 teams out of the total teams will qualify for the next round.
- VIII. Stage II that is, the Preliminary Round, will consist of questions revolving around LLB course content. 6 teams out of the 12 teams will qualify for the third and the final round.
- IX. Teams selected for the final round will be allowed to give themselves an appropriate name related to the competition by which they may want to be known.
- X. In Stage II, The Final Round, only one out of the six competing teams shall be declared as the winner of the **Lex Lusor**.
- XI. There will be a surprise/tie breaking round in case of tie in the final round.
- XII. The winning team shall be given certificates and a prize. All the other participants shall get certificates.
- XIII. The decision of the quiz-master will be final and will not be subjected to any change.
- XIV. The participants shall not be allowed to use mobiles or other electronic gadgets.



- XV. Audience shall not give any hints or clues to the competitors.
- XVI. Replacement of any participant of a team is not allowed after registration.

3. REGISTRATION FEE:

- I. INR 1000/- per team.

4. PRIZE:

- I. First Prize Rs. 4000/- .
- II. Second Prize Rs. 3000/-.
- III. Third Prize Rs. 2000/-.

5. SAVING CLAUSE

- I. The Quiz Master decision will be final and binding.
- II. The Organisers reserve the rights to mend any rule and the same shall be notified to all the teams well in time

MAXIM BEE

1. REGISTRATION:

- I. Maximum two members per team pursuing LLB (3 years), B.A.LL.B, B.COM.LL.B, BBA LL.B., (5 years). Multiple teams from same college are allowed.

2. RULES AND REGULATIONS

- I. First 30 teams will be considered on first come first serve.
- II. Each member should register and bring ID card at the venue.
- III. The competition will have two stages.
- IV. In the first stage elimination round would be conducted based on Law Maxim.
- V. The top 8 teams qualifying stage 1 will be selected for the stage 2.
- VI. In stage 2 the teams would be asked the meaning of the maxims.
- VII. There would be negative marking during the elimination round.
- VIII. The top two teams will be declared would be given the cash prizes and certificate would be given all the participants.

3. REGISTRATION FEE:

- I. INR 1000 per team.



4. **PRIZE:**

- I. First Prize Rs. 4000/- .

TREASURE HUNT:

1. **RULES & REGULATIONS:**

- Multiple teams per institution allowed.
- A Team can consist of 2 to 5 members. (minimum 2 & maximum 5 members)
- Institution ID card is mandatory.
- Each team will be allotted a particular colour, which will represent your team.
- The Treasure Hunt consists of 10-12 clues. Each correctly solved clue carries 10 points. And, final Treasure carries 30 points.
- The clues are to be found in a particular order. Skipping a clue leads to deduction of 5 points.
- Do not search for clues in off-limit areas. (Areas will be displayed)
- If you found other team's clue by any chance never tamper it. A violation of this rule could cause disqualification of your team.
- You can move any object to search the clue, kindly replace it back.
- All the clues of the teams are located at different places.

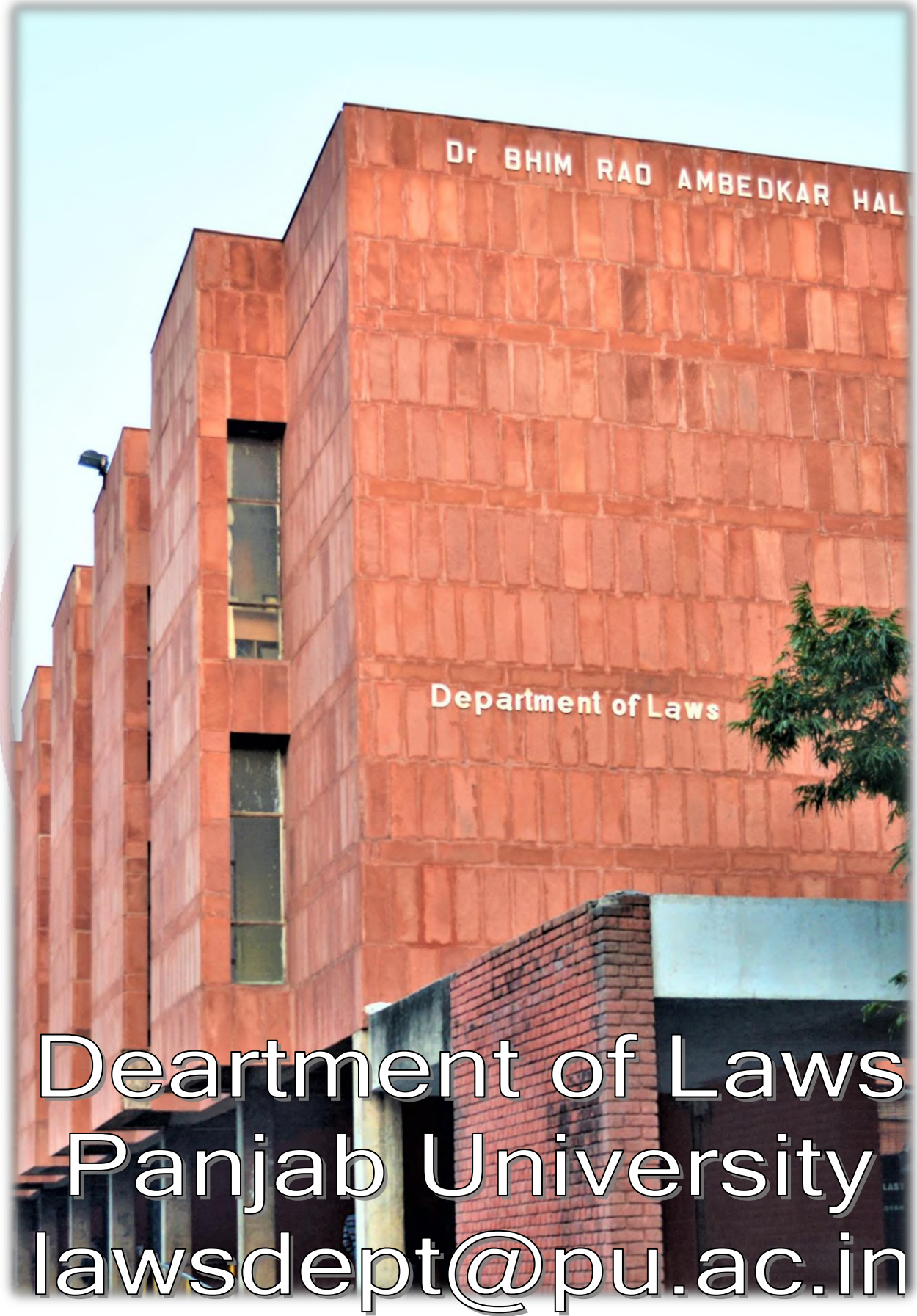
