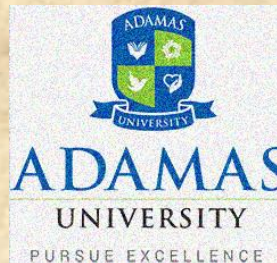

Seminar on Women & Law in Contemporary India

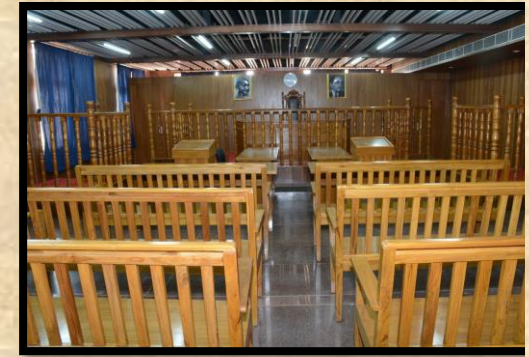
About the Seminar-
