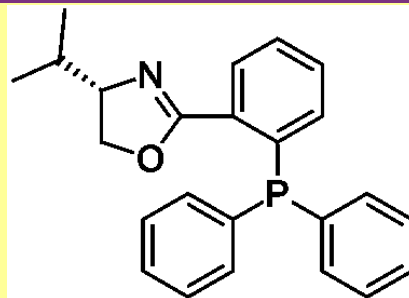

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

Chapter:

Chapter should be in Times New Roman 12 point font and double spaced. Main Title should be in full capitals, bold and centered 16 point font. Sub-titles should be in sentence case, bold and 12 point font. Author's names should be in small capitals and centered 14 point font Footnotes should be in Times New Roman 10 point font.

Citation Format:

Please use footnotes rather than endnotes. Footnotes should conform to the JILI (Journal of Indian Law Institute), format of JILI provided on <http://www.ili.ac.in/footnoting12.pdf> or www.ili.ac.in

Submission of the abstract:

A covering letter with the name(s) of the author(s) and address, designation, institution/affiliation, the title of the manuscript and contact information (email, phone, etc.) is compulsory to submit. All submissions must contain an abstract of not more than 300 words.

* Originality of Manuscripts:

All the contributions should be the original work of the contributors and should not have been submitted for consideration in any other Publication. Any plagiarized work will be out-rightly rejected.

* Copyright:

The contributions presented to and accepted for publication and the copyrights therein shall be the intellectual property of Publisher.

* Copyright Agreement Form:

The Copyright Agreement form should be submitted once your article has been accepted for publication. Manuscripts cannot be published without this form. The corresponding author is responsible for obtaining signatures of co-authors.

* Anonymous Review:

To facilitate our anonymous review process, please confine your name, affiliation and biographical information to a separate cover page. Please include the manuscript's title on the first text page.
