 - Names, designation and address of the author(s) including Email and Phone Number.
- The Abstract and full paper should be submitted in MS Word format with the following word limit: abstract 400 to 500 words and final paper 4000 – 5000 words (excluding footnotes). Font type -Times New Roman, 12 fonts, 1.5 line spacing and 1 inch margin in all the sides and uniform method of citation should be followed.
