ABOUT CONSTITUTIONAL DAY

Constitutional Day, also known as Samvidhaan Divas or Law Day, is celebrated in India on 26th November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. 70 years ago on 26th November, 1949 the people of independent India gave to themselves the cherished Constitution, containing the details of how to run the three years old welfare state of India. Although the majority of the Constitution came into force on 26th January, 1950; whose anniversary is celebrated every year in India as Republic Day, some provisions relating to citizenship, elections, provisional Parliament, temporary and transitional provisions were given immediate effect on 26th November, 1949. Therefore, this day is of great importance to the Indians because not only this day marked the beginning of a new journey of the Sovereign, Democratic, Republic India, but also gave us the framework from which all the laws of this land attain their life force.

ABOUT THE CHIEF GUEST

Dr. Justice N. Kumar is a former Judge, High Court of Karnataka, Executive Chairman, ICADR, Bangalore and presently also holds the National Human Rights Commission Chair on Human Rights. He was enrolled as an Advocate in 1976 and started practice on the original side and extended the practice to the High Court of Karnataka. He elevated as the Judge of the High Court of Karnataka in 2000. He was the President of Karnataka Judicial Academic for a long period and he is actively involved in training Judicial Officers of the State of Karnataka in the Judicial Academy.

ABOUT THE SEMINAR

When India gained independence, it was the intention of the framers of the Constitution of India to mould the newly born free India into a welfare state. It took two years, eleven months and seventeen days to complete the historic task of drafting the Constitution, during which eleven sessions, covering a total of 165 days, were held so as to minutely discuss every aspect of the provisions required to fulfil the aims enshrined in the Preamble. The debates that they underwent and the resultant provisions that they drafted were so thorough, detailed and apt that the honourable framers of the Constitution were able to predict and provide for almost every type of possible circumstances that would have arrived in future. Even after the passage of seven decades of the framing of the Indian Constitution, we can still find relation between the debates held then and the contemporary issues happening now. This seminar focusses on finding the link between the CADs and the contemporary issues of present.

- ▶ Word limit for Abstract: 250-300 words
- ▶ Word Limit for Full Paper:3000-4000 words (including footnotes)
- ▶ The margins are to be 1", text is to be justified and OSCOLA format of citation is to be used.
- ▶ Plagiarism beyond 20% will lead to disqualification.
- ▶ Presentation must be done using Powerpoint Presentation.
